



Three universal truths.

Stay the course	Persistent inequity and ineffective system


Bolstering Papacity

- Technical Assistance: We do the work for you.



Accessible, affordable TA that addresses capacity challenges:

Time	Teams can collaborate asynchronously - when each person has the time
Expertise	Deep knowledge base and best practices built into the infrastructure of the TA in one place - no searching for it
Creativity	Creates near-final drafts of everything you need to implement change - policy, processes, slide decks, press releases, etc.
Motivation	Can't create initial motivation, but helps sustain it by lightening the load and accelerating progress
